2nd Annual Railroad Day Was Held at Maywood Station on June 24, 2007

The Maywood Station Historical Committee hosted a Special Open House on June 24, 2007 joined by local railroad historical societies, model railroad clubs, vendors and model railroad manufacturers. The Maywood Station Museum was open and outdoor displays and exhibits were shown on the station grounds including N-scale and HO scale modular model train layouts as well as the Maywood Station Historical Committee's N-scale model layout inside Caboose 24542. An estimated 600-plus visitors attended the 2nd Annual Railroad Day, which marked it as the single largest event in Maywood Station Museum history. Exhibitors included Atlas Model Railroad Company; Bergen-Rockland Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society; Deluxe Innovations; Garden State Model Railroad Club; Loose Caboose Hobby Shop; Maywood Station Historical Committee; New York, Ontario & Western Historical Society; New York, Susquehanna & Western Technical & Historical Society: Northern New Jersey N-Trak; Operation Lifesaver; and Shortline Hobbies. The MSHC wishes to thank Tony & Tina Pizzanelli and Triboro Resturant and Pizzeria of Maywood, NJ for providing food and beverages for the event.

<u>Classic Car Show Was Featured at the August 5,</u> 2007 Museum Open House

The Sunday, August 5, 2007 Maywood Station Museum Open House featured a classic car show on the station grounds, which included an original General Lee Dodge Charger from the 1970's The Dukes of Hazard television series as well as an assortment of vintage automobiles. The Maywood Station Museum was open during the car show and visitors were treated to a variety of historical artifacts, displays and photographs. Maywood Station Caboose #24542 was also open for the event and visitors were welcome to climb aboard to see the operating model train layout and additional historical items. Tony & Tina Pizzanelli of Triboro Restaurant and Pizzeria once again provided food and beverages for the event. The weather was great and the event proved to be another large event for the MSHC with an estimated 300-plus visitors attending.



On August 5, 2007, the MSHC held a **Maywood Station Museum Open House & Classic Car Show**. A wide assortment of classic cars was on display at the station during the Open House including a **General Lee** Dodge Charger from the 1970's hit TV series **The Dukes of Hazard**. An added surprise occurred when the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railway momentarily posed the oldest active locomotive on their roster at the station – GP18 #1800, an 1800 horsepower, 1962-built Electro-Motive Division of General Motors locomotive. Remembering Walter Rich

In the early morning of August 9, 2007, Walter Rich, President, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railway Corporation passed away at age 61 after a battle with pancreatic cancer. Walter was a friend of the Maywood Station Historical Committee and took a keen interest in the restoration of Maywood Station and the transformation into the museum it now is. A debt of gratitude is owed to Walter by the historical and railroad communities for his input in seeing the rebirth of Maywood Station into a reality. Walter began his railroad career in the late 1960's starting with a 2-mile shortline in upstate New York that would eventually evolve into today's 400-mile plus regional railroad operating in New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania. Always involved in railroad industry matters and railroad history, Walter's contributions to the industry he loved and the preservation community will be sorely missed. Our condolences go out to his wife Karine and family.

Maywood Station H.O. and N Scale Models Available

Atlas Model Railroad Company H.O. (1/87) scale and N (1/160th) scale models of Maywood Station are now available. The models accurately depict the station and include the brick pathway, benches and fencing. They are available in 3 different paint schemes that were originally found on the station - beige/brown; gray/maroon; and pale green/dark green. The model is available for purchase at the Maywood Station Museum on 2007 Open House dates and seven days a week at Maywood Hardware, 39 West Pleasant Avenue, Maywood. Built-up versions of the H.O. scale models are priced at \$38.00 each and kit versions are priced at \$22.00 each. Built-up versions of the N-scale models are priced at \$28.00 each and kit versions are priced at \$18.00 each. Engraved Bricks Are Still Available

The MSHC will continue to accept orders for engraved bricks that will be incorporated into the brick platform that surrounds Maywood Station. Engraved bricks are available in two sizes – 4" X 8" for \$55 each and 8" X 8" for \$250 each. All orders are tax-deductible and will be confirmed by mail with a donation letter. Engraved bricks ordered between January 1, 2007 and June 30, 2007 will be installed at the station in early fall 2007. Engraved bricks ordered between July 1, 2007 and December 31, 2007 will be installed at the station in early spring 2008.
