The Mooncussers performed a live concert as part of the **Maywood Station Museum Backyard Summer Concert Series Sponsored By Park Ave Acura** on the Maywood Station Museum grounds at the Wednesday evening, July 20 Open House. An assortment of displays, artifacts and photographs were also on exhibit in the museum.

The Mooncussers were fronted by Steve Liesman, Senior Economics Reporter for the cable financial television channel **CNBC**. He appears on **CNBC's** financial news program **Squawk Box** on weekday mornings from 6 to 9 a.m as well as other **CNBC** and **NBC** financial programs throughout the Business Day. Liesman is an award winning journalist, honored with an Emmy Award for his reporting on the U. S. Financial Crisis and a Pulitzer Prize for his reporting on the Russian Financial Crisis.

The band was comprised of Steve Liesman on lead guitar and vocals; Pete Carucci on rhythm guitar and vocals; Scott Scheavitz on bass and Dave Gross on mandolin. The band performed a mix of older and contemporary rock songs to an enthusiastic crowd. *Deejay John Brown* entertained the crowd before and after the event.

<u>Dave Murphy Performed at August 24, 2011 Maywood Station Museum Open House/Concert</u>

Dave Murphy and his band performed a live concert as part of the **Maywood Station Museum Backyard Summer Concert Series Sponsored By Park Ave Acura** on the Maywood Station Museum grounds at the Wednesday evening, August 24, 2011 Open House. The museum was also open during the concert and featured a variety of exhibits, artifacts and photographs on display.

Dave Murphy is an acclaimed songwriter and recording artist who performed collection of original songs with his band from his five albums. Elements of his influences - Neil Young, Bob Dylan, The Byrds and Roger McQuinn can be felt in his music. His most recent album, Yellow Moon, was released this past spring to rave reviews. Starting in 1998, Dave released his first album, a self-produced effort titled Under the Lights. The album garnered a prestigious "Top 12 DIY" pick in the December 1999 issue of Performing Songwriter Magazine. Dave subsequently released four more albums, all on his own Phoenix Night label. He has received awards and rave reviews, performed at hundreds of venues across the country from the renowned Kerrville Folk Festival in Texas to the intimate Tin Angel in Philadelphia. He's shared the stage with some of the world's great Americana artists including Suzanne Vega. Slaid Cleaves, Alejandro Escovedo and Steve Forbert. His music has been featured on New York City's WFUV 90.7FM, where he has appeared on John Platt's show. The new Yellow Moon album is loaded with moments from a particular intimate relationship. All the invigorating and demoralizing parts are there and the voice has a resignation, swelling and painful, through different turns, but always with a subtext of hope.





The Maywood Station Museum Store now has available two new books written by historian, author and Maywood Station Historical Committee President, Edward S. Kaminski and published by Arcadia Publishing Company. Maywood - The The Railroad, and The Station traces Maywood's history from a farming community through its population and industrial growth brought on in part by the coming of the New Jersey Midland Railway in 1872. Separate chapters include The Borough of Maywood; The New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad in Maywood; and Maywood Station including its role in the development of Maywood and its recent restoration and museum. New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad in New Jersey, traces the history of the railroad from the late 19th century through the 20th century and covers the complete route of all its mainline track and branches in New Jersev. 
