Maywood Hardware Closes its Doors

A sad day occurred in Maywood this past January when Maywood Hardware closed its doors for the last time. The hardware store, located at 39 West Pleasant Avenue, opened in 1949 and had been in the Miller/Tamayne families since its inception 62 years ago. Maywood Hardware was the oldest family-owned business in Maywood as well as one of the oldest businesses in town.

When the restoration of Maywood Station began in June 2002, a goal of the MSHC was to give as much business for the necessary supplies needed for the restoration project to local business. Maywood Hardware became the "go to place" for many items that were used in the restoration including nails, screws, glass, varnish, sealers, paint, paint brushes, ladders, floor polish, plaques, glue, light bulbs, landscaping items, extension cords, flags, decorations, garbage cans, power tools, hammers.....and the list goes on. They even stocked Maywood Station Museum Store items for us on their shelves.

Steve Tamayne and Henry and Barbara Miller always treated the MSHC's needs with kindness and professionalism. Their hardware store will sorely be missed by The MSHC and the residents of Maywood as well as the local area and we wish them well. Maywood has truly lost a piece of small-town Americana.

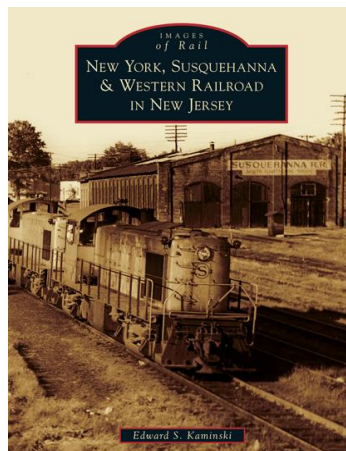
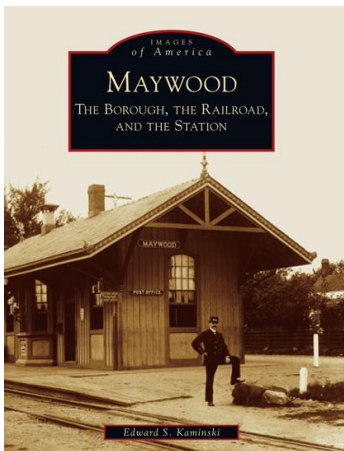

The Maywood Station Museum Store now has available two new books written by historian, author and Maywood Station Historical Committee President, Edward S. Kaminski and published by Arcadia Publishing Company. **Maywood - The Borough, The Railroad, and The Station** traces Maywood's history from a farming community through its population and industrial growth brought on in part by the coming of the New Jersey Midland Railway in 1872. Separate chapters include The Borough of Maywood; The New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad in Maywood; and Maywood Station including its role in the development of Maywood and its recent restoration and museum. **New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad in New Jersey**, traces the history of the railroad from the late 19th century through the 20th century and covers the complete route of all its mainline track and branches in New Jersey. Maywood Station Museum 2010 Holiday is Released!

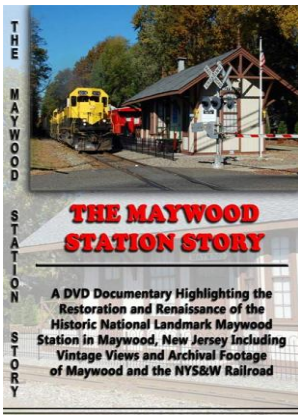

Engraved Bricks Are Still Available

The MSHC will continue to accept orders for engraved bricks that will be incorporated into the brick platform that surrounds Maywood Station. Engraved bricks are available in two sizes – 4" X 8" for \$75 each and 8" X 8" for \$250 each. All orders are tax-deductible and will be confirmed by mail with a donation letter. Engraved bricks ordered between July 1, 2010 and December 31, 2010 will be installed at the station in early spring 2011. Engraved bricks ordered between January 1, 2011 and June 30, 2011 will be installed at the station in early fall 2011.
