The Maywood Station Museum 2014 Year in Review

Year 2014 concluded another busy and record year for the Maywood Station Museum. Aside from the usual mix of preservation and maintenance items we attend to as well as a new restoration project, membership had a very challenging schedule of museum open houses and events.


2014 started out with the **The Easter Bunny at the Maywood Station Museum** event on April 12. The event was very successful again this year with approximately 300 visitors. On September 21, the museum hosted its **Annual Railroad Day at Maywood Station Museum**. The event was well received as always, and an estimated 500 people visited the station that day. The **Annual Santa at Maywood Station Museum** event on December 13 enjoyed great weather and was one of our largest Santa events with an estimated 425 people attending.

Public attendance figures to the museum's 2014 schedule between April and December of two regular Sunday open houses on June 8 and November 9; one regular Wednesday evening open house July 30; the Easter Bunny at the Maywood Station Museum event on Saturday, April 12; the Annual Railroad Day at Maywood Station Museum event on Sunday, September 21; and the Annual Santa at Maywood Station Museum event on Saturday, December 14 came in 5.9% above 2013. This was exceptional since we conducted one less regular open house in 2014. The museum also had the good fortune of enjoying favorable weather conditions at each open house/event. Additionally, the Wednesday evening July 30 regular open house had an unusually high amount of visitors approaching nearly 250 people. This was the largest attendance ever for a weekday evening open house.

For the year 2014, the Maywood Station Museum drew 2571 visitors, up from the year 2013 total of 2419. This signified a 5.9% increase. Prior year totals were 2387 in year 2012; 2577 in year 2011; 2351 in year 2001; 2289 in year 2009; 1982 in year 2008, 2142 in year 2007, 1967 in year 2006; and 1621 in year 2005 - the first year of museum operations. The museum also saw a 38.4% increase in revenue from open houses as compared to year 2013. Maywood Station models; as well as general donations and commercial photos all helped contribute to the bottom line. Online sales through the Maywood Station Museum website's Museum Store posted an increase of 373% over 2013 led by very strong annual calendar, books and H.O. scale #206 model sales.

The 2014 Maywood Station Museum Holiday Ornament, which was released on September 21 at the *Annual Railroad Day at the Maywood Station Museum* event, was nearly sold-out by year's end. The annual ornament continues to be a strong year-end fundraiser for the museum.

Year 2014 also brought new additions and donations to the museum including several artifacts to the collection.

Aside from the upcoming Museum Open Houses and events scheduled for 2015, membership will be working on several maintenance and preservation items as well as continuing restoration work on the original New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad semaphore signal. The semaphore pole and base was moved to the station in the summer of 2013 and membership has been slowly working on this intricate project.

The Maywood Station Museum membership takes great care in maintaining the museum, rolling stock and grounds. If you haven't visited our museum in the past, we invite you to come to an open house or event in 2015 and experience our museum for the first time. If you've visited in the past, make plans to visit us again and see our new displays, exhibits and events.




