NYS&W ALCO S-2 Locomotive #206 is Placed on the National Register of Historic Places

On March 19, 2010, the Maywood Station Historical Committee was advised by the State of New Jersey Historical Preservation Office that the nomination for original New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad 1942-built ALCO S-2 Locomotive #206 was approved and the historic locomotive has been placed immediately onto the National Register of Historic Places. The locomotive, located at Maywood Station, now joins 1872-built Maywood Station on the National Register of Historic Places and the State of New Jersey Register of Historical Places. NYS&W #206 is also one of only a few pieces of rail equipment located in the State of New Jersey listed on the National Register of Historic Places and the only one located in Bergen County.

The NYS&W #206 is the sole survivor of six 1000-horsepower S-2 locomotives built in late 1941 and early 1942 for the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad that were numbered 202, 203, 204, 205, 206 and 208. A production total of 1502 ALCO S-2 locomotives were built but only approximately 50 survive today. In October 2008, NYS&W #206 was acquired from the United Railroad Historical Society of New Jersey by the New York, Susquehanna & Western Technical & Historical Society/Maywood Station Historical Committee and moved to Maywood Station. Work on the historic locomotive by MSHC members began immediately and restoration of the exterior into its 1950's NYS&W paint scheme has been completed.

Original NYS&W CTC Board is Donated to the Maywood Station Museum

The original New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad Centralized Traffic Control (CTC) Board was donated to the Maywood Station Museum by Scott Dressler along the original telegraph/telephone circuit board and 100's of original NYS&W maps, drawings and valuation maps. The MSHC took receipt of the items in March and April. The CTC Board and telegraph/telephone circuit board are completely intact and are welcome additions to the Maywood Station Museum collection. The CTC Board is highly significant in the history of the railroad and was used between 1952 and 1966 when the NYS&W was headquartered at Broadway Station in Paterson, NJ. The NYS&W is noted for utilizing one of the shortest centralized traffic control districts in the country, which was operated between Jersey City, NJ and Ridgefield Park, NJ. The CTC Board allowed the operator to automatically throw switches, change signals and route trains from the Broadway Station in Paterson offices. The CTC Board was retired in 1966 with the end of passenger service on the NYS&W and is the only one in existence.



Maywood Station™ is the prototype for this museum-quality, laser-cut, O-scale (1/48th) craftsman-type model kit produced by Atlas Model Railroad Company. The model is a full scale replica of the actual Maywood Station™ built in 1872 by the New Jersey Midland Railroad (predecessor to the present-day New York Susquehanna & Western Railway) in Maywood, New Jersey. Stations built to similar Victorian-era designs could be found at one time in small towns and suburbs of larger cities on railroads across the United States.

- Approx. finished size (including base): 18.5" x 9.5" x 6"



Engraved bricks ordered between January 1, 2010 and June 30, 2010 will be installed at the station in early fall 2010. Engraved bricks ordered between July 1, 2010 and December 31, 2010 will be installed at the station in early spring 2011.
