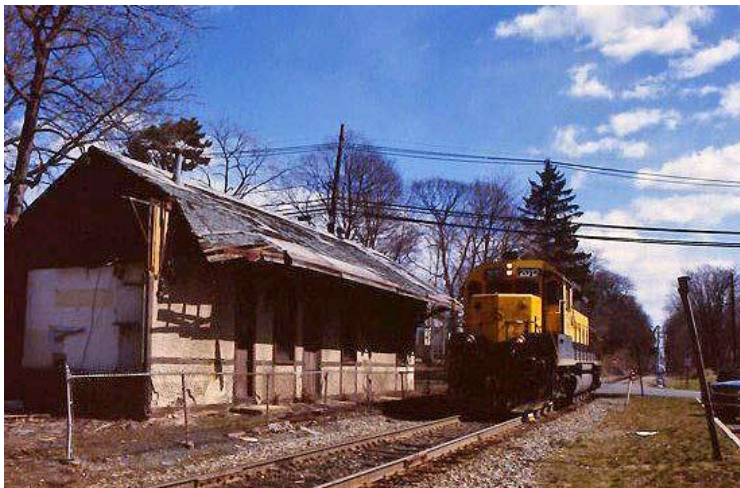

The Maywood Station Historical Committee Celebrates 10 Years!

The all-volunteer, 501(C)3 non-profit Maywood Station Historical Committee Division of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Technical & Historical Society, Inc. was formed by member Ed Kaminski on May 29, 2002 in an effort to save and restore the historic 1872 built New York, Susquehanna & Western train station on Maywood Avenue. Ten years have now passed and the National Register Landmark station was restored and opened as a museum 2004; expanded in 2005 with acquisition of Caboose 24542; and expanded again in 2008 with original 1942-built New York Susquehanna & Western Railroad ALCO S-2 diesel locomotive #206 (also listed as a National Register Landmark).

A hallmark of our success has been a strong volunteer membership that maintains the museum and works hard to archive and display many of the museums holdings to the public during our museum open house schedule each year. The museum offers many opportunities to increase historic awareness and we are very fortunate that a stream of inventive ideas is always forthcoming from our membership. One of the more recent ones began in 2011 when we started combining summer museum open houses with a free outdoor concert series on the station grounds on Wednesday evenings featuring local performers in partnership with our sponsor Park Ave Acura. Look for the summer concert series to expand even further in 2012.

We also wish to thank the many individuals and local businesses through the years for their continued support and donations to the museum.

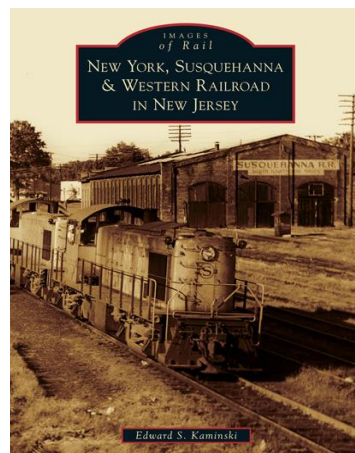
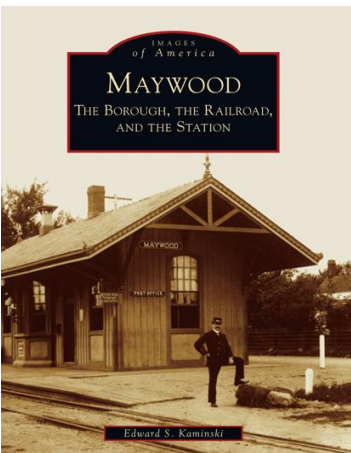

Available Now!! - Maywood & NYS&W in New Jersey Books!

The Maywood Station Museum Store now has available two new books written by historian, author and Maywood Station Historical Committee President, Edward S. Kaminski and published by Arcadia Publishing Company. ***Maywood - The Borough, The Railroad, and The Station*** traces Maywood's history from a farming community through its population and industrial growth brought on in part by the coming of the New Jersey Midland Railway in 1872. Separate chapters include The Borough of Maywood; The New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad in Maywood; and Maywood Station including its role in the development of Maywood and its recent restoration and museum. ***New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad in New Jersey***, traces the history of the railroad from the late 19th century through the 20th century and covers the complete route of all its mainline track and branches in New Jersey. Each 128-page book contains over 200 quality images with detailed captions and are available for \$22.00 each at Maywood Station on Museum Open House dates or by mail order through our website at www.maywoodstation.com. All proceeds from the sales of books through mail order on the Maywood Station Museum website and at Maywood Station on Museum Open House dates, including the author's royalties, will go toward further preservation and maintenance of the historic Maywood Station Museum.

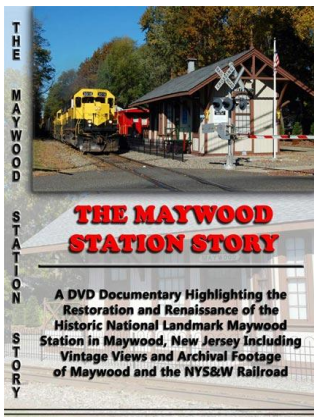

The Maywood Station Historical Committee is an all-volunteer, 501C3 non-profit, educational and historical society dedicated to the preservation, education and maintenance of the 1872-built New York, Susquehanna & Western railroad station in Maywood, NJ. The station is listed on the National, State of New Jersey and Bergen County Registers of Historical Places and is listed as a State of New Jersey Historic Archive. Membership in our organization includes participation in our meetings and work sessions; periodic e-mail updates on station news and events; discounts on MSHC merchandise; and our quarterly newsletter. It is a requirement that all MSHC members must join our parent organization, the New York, Susquehanna & Western Technical & Historical Society. Dues are \$25 for individuals per calendar year and include *The Reflector* Magazine and the annual all-color calendar as well as help support the restoration, preservation and maintenance of all NYS&WT&HS/MSHC sites, equipment and operations. The MSHC continues to accept orders for engraved bricks that will be incorporated into the brick platform that surrounds Maywood Station. **A limited number of Engraved bricks remain available in 4" X 8" size for \$75 each. The 8" X 8" size is NO LONGER AVAILABLE and all spaces have been filled.** Ordering forms are available at Maywood Station on Museum Open House dates and a printable ordering form with more information is available on our website at www.maywoodstation.com. All orders are tax-deductible and will be confirmed by mail with a donation letter. Engraved bricks ordered between January 1, 2012 and June 30, 2012 will be installed at the station in early fall 2012. Engraved bricks ordered between July 1, 2012 and December 31, 2012 will be installed at the station in early spring 2013.
