# <u>Vintage Miniature Car Exhibit Was Featured at the</u> November 11, 2007 Museum Open House

A special exhibit of vintage *Matchbox*, *Hot Wheels* and *Johnny Lightning* miniature cars courtesy of Douglas Dezso and Maywood Station Historical Committee member Ed Kaminski were featured at the November 11, 2007 Maywood Station Museum Open House. In the 1960's, *Matchbox* cars gained popularity and competing companies like Mattel soon followed by introducing their *Hot Wheels* line. In the ensuing years, quite a demand for vintage miniature cars has developed and they are much sought after by collectors. The exhibit contained numerous examples of automobiles, trucks and hot rods from the 1950's through the 1970's and sparked a lot of childhood memories for visitors to the Open House

#### The Year in Review - President's Report

As 2007 comes to close, I'd like to thank our membership for all the hard work they've done and for the many accomplishments we've had this past year. While the majority of the visible exterior work has been accomplished, we continue to make improvements inside the station and inside Caboose #24542 as well as we have been working hard on archiving a vast collection of drawings and photographs. In fact, a major archiving project involving the sorting, scanning and cataloging several thousand historic drawings was started last December and completed this October. We also kept busy displaying and archiving many new artifacts, which were donated by individuals this past year.

2007 brought several challenges and some surprises. We ended the year with 2142 visitors to the Maywood Station Museum - our best year ever! The total surpassed 1967 visitors in 2006 and 1621 visitors in 2005, the museum's first year of operation. These totals are based on the number of visitors to our regularly scheduled 7 open house events per year. As you can see, we are experiencing exceptional growth and seeing about 25% more visitors than we did in our first year, just 2 years ago. We had some great 2007 Museum Open House events - a Vintage Camera Exhibit, Maywood Fire Department Day, our Annual Railroad Day, a Vintage Car Show, a Vintage Candy Container Exhibit, a Vintage Miniature Car Exhibit and our Annual Santa at Maywood Station. Add to this the numerous Boys and Girl Scout tours and special group tours for various organizations. I'm grateful to our group of members who staff our open houses and special tours and do it with such professionalism. The success of our open houses and special tours relate directly to our ability to cover our costs of operating the museum and permit us to continue to provide a valuable resource for the public.

In 2007, we made great progress inside Caboose #24542 and the basic scenery portion of the operating train layout is moving along. Caboose #24542 has become a major attraction at our Museum Open Houses for young and old alike.

However, the year 2007 has come with a loss for us. In August, Walter Rich, President, Chairman & CEO of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railway passed away. Walter was a great supporter of Maywood Station and he continues to be missed by all of us. We wish Nathan Fenno much success as their new President.

As we look forward to 2008, we have several projects ongoing and on the drawing board including an acquisition of a historic piece of railroad equipment that we will embark on restoring. The outlook is great for another successful Maywood Station Museum Open House season and we and our sister organization, the New York, Susquehanna & Western Technical & Historical Society are both in excellent shape. Here's to a great New Year to our members, their families, our friends and our supporters! – Ed Kaminski

# <u>Vintage Candy Container Exhibit Was Shown at the September 23, 2007 Museum Open House</u>

A special exhibit of vintage Candy Containers from the collection of Maywood resident Douglas Dezso was featured at the Sunday, September 23, 2007 Maywood Station Museum Open House. The Candy Containers, made mainly of glass in the early 1900's through 1950's period showcased a variety of styles including trains, automobiles, trucks, gas pumps, lanterns and other types. Many of these once common collectibles have now become very rare and are sought by collectors worldwide. Mr. Dezso is one of the world's foremost authorities on the subject of vintage Candy Containers and has authored the book A Collector's Guide to Candy Container's - Identification & Values. #### Maywood Station H.O. and N Scale Models Available

Atlas Model Railroad Company H.O. (1/87th) scale and N (1/160th) scale models of Maywood Station are now available. The models accurately depict the station and include the brick pathway, benches and fencing. They are available in 3 different paint schemes that were originally found on the station - tan/brown; gray/maroon; and pale green/dark green. The models are available for purchase at the Maywood Station Museum on 2008 Open House dates and seven days a week at Maywood Hardware, 39 West Pleasant Avenue, Maywood. Built-up versions of the H.O. scale models are priced at \$38.00 each and kit versions are priced at \$22.00 each. Built-up versions of the N-scale models are priced at \$28.00 each and kit versions are priced at \$18.00 each. # **Engraved Bricks Are Still Available**

The MSHC will continue to accept orders for engraved bricks that will be incorporated into the brick platform that surrounds Maywood Station. Engraved bricks are available in two sizes – 4" X 8" for \$55 each and 8" X 8" for \$250 each. All orders are tax-deductible and will be confirmed by mail with a donation letter. Engraved bricks ordered between July 1, 2007 and December 31, 2007 will be installed at the station in early spring 2008. Engraved bricks ordered between January 1, 2008 and June 30, 2008 will be installed at the station in early fall 2008.
